Today is Abraham Lincoln's birthday! In Illinois, we call ourselves the Land of Lincoln because of the time Lincoln spent here establishing himself as a politician. There are many historical sites pertaining to Abraham Lincoln in Illinois, and the Macon County Conservation District has two: The Paris-Springfield Road and Governor Oglesby's Mansion.

The Paris-Springfield road was traveled by Abraham Lincoln and his family when they first settled in Illinois, and Lincoln also used the road many times when traveling the state as a lawyer and a politician. Part of this road is now preserved and open to visitors at Sand Creek Conservation Area.

Governor Oglesby was a friend and political ally of Abraham Lincoln. A significant historical figure in his own right, he fought in both the Mexican War and the Civil War, was elected as governor of Illinois three times, and served as a United States Senator. His mansion was a beautiful Italianate style home, and it has been preserved to include furnishings from the era and several items owned by the Oglesby family.
